Camp Activities & Fun

Campers will have a fantastic time playing games, creating artwork, exploring the outdoors, and making new friends. Camp activities will include sports, nature exploration, arts & crafts, and team building activities. All campers will enjoy sports like, foosball soccer, relay races, kickball, obstacle courses, and more! Every day, campers are engaged in a variety of art & craft projects. Often our theme days inspire artistic expression using paint, clay, beads, and other materials to create minions, monsters, mammals, and more! Your child will explore the Recreation Center's beautiful outdoor campus through nature hikes, pond studies, and scavenger hunts, as well as a camper favorite-GaGa Pit.

Water Fun

On various days, campers will enjoy outdoor water fun with our Spray Bay, sprinklers or water games out on our fields. Older Campers will also spend time in our indoor pool. Explorers enjoy outdoor water fun only. Pioneers and Rangers will enjoy the zero-entry section of the pool for their recreational swim. Travelers, Trailblazers, Voyagers, and Discoverers will have scheduled time in the pool with additional organized water games and relay races. Counselors will remain in the water with the campers, and lifeguards will be on duty. Each week, campers are given a swim test to ensure that they are swimming in the appropriate area of the pool.

Older campers will go to places like Adventure Park, Club Getaway, and Lake Compounce. The field trip schedule is posted on our website when it's confirmed.

Special Events & Themes

Camp will include a different theme every day to keep the program exciting and entertaining throughout the summer. Examples of themes that may occur are Color Competition, Field Day, Crazy Hair Day, and Tie-Dye Day. Weekly in-house field trips may include visits from a petting zoo, magician, dancers, and more! Parents will receive a weekly schedule the week before the start of their child's camp.

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T-shirts

All Campers will receive a camp shirt on their first day at camp. Older Campers must wear this shirt for ALL field trips, including Martin Park Beach on Tuesday. Pack an extra T-shirt on these days.

TOP 10 FOR ADVENTURE DAY CAMP PARENTS

1. Pack everyday:

Wear bathing suit under clothing. For footwear, sneakers or water shoes are best. Bring 2 towels, a water bottle, a nut-free snack and lunch, extra clothes, sunscreen, goggles, and a plastic bag for wet items. Wear the Recreation Center t-shirt (provided on the first day of camp) for all field trips including Martin Park Beach. If trip is water-related, pack a shirt in addition to the camp shirt. **Please do NOT pack toys or electronics from home. Do NOT pack money for vending machines or field trips.**

2. Label everything!!!

Especially clothing, towels, and sunscreen. If an item is lost, check with your child's counselor.

3. Forms

No forms required with online registration. For in-person registration, there will be a camp registration form only; no medical or doctor's physical required.

4. Arrival/Dismissal

Camp begins at 9:00 am and ends at 4:00 pm. Please be prompt in order to provide a smooth transition for all campers and drivers.

We offer curbside drop-off/pick-up everyday. We ask families to put GROUP and CAMPER name on a sign in the front window of your vehicle. Pull up to your group sign as far forward as possible while not blocking the crosswalks or handicap spaces. Camp staff will approach and assist campers into/out of vehicles on the Curb Side ONLY.

Do not drop off your child unless a staff member is present, and please do not leave your vehicle. For safety, drive slowly and use your directional signal while pulling away from the curb, as cars will be passing on the left side.

5. Alternate Pick-Up Person

Parent should email Camp Director at campcoor@ridgefieldct.gov with: child's name, date(s), name of pick-up person, and the pick-up person's telephone number. At the time of pick-up, photo ID will be required.

6. Early dismissal

Parent should email Camp Director at campcoor@ridgefieldct.gov with: child's name, person picking up, time of departure. Or a parent can give a written note with the same information to your child's counselor. At the time of pick-up, parent/guardian should go to the Front Desk and ask for the Camp Director or Camp Administrator. Child(ren) will be brought to you.

7. Sunscreen

Please apply sunscreen before camp and send a labeled bottle of sunscreen with your camper (spray preferred). Sunscreen will be reapplied one time daily around lunch time. Counselors will assist campers if / when needed.

8. Communication

Theme day information will be emailed to parents the week prior to their camp week. Parents/guardians can email Camp Staff at campcoor@ ridgefieldct.gov at anytime with questions.

9. Please let us know ...

Any accommodations or strategies that work well with your child. Insights about your child, such as fears, allergies, and dislikes, will help our counselors provide a better day for the campers. Counselors appreciate updates throughout the summer. We want everyone to have a safe and fun day here at the Recreation Center!

10. Electronics & Social Media

For safety/privacy reasons and to ensure engagement in activities, the use of cell phones, iPods, iPads, MP3 Players, and electronic games during camp hours is prohibited. If a camper brings any hand held electronics, they must stay in the camper's bag or it may be confiscated by Camp Administration. We are not responsible for any items that may be lost or stolen.

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ADVENTURE DAY CAMP FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What do the children need to bring to camp?

ALL campers should arrive wearing their bathing suit under clothing. For footwear, sneakers or water shoes are best. Bring 2 towels, a water bottle, a NUT-FREE snack and lunch, extra clothes, sunscreen, goggles, and a plastic bag for wet items.

Apply water-proof or water-resistant sunscreen before camp and send a bottle of sunscreen labeled with your camper's name (spray preferred). Sunscreen will be reapplied one time daily around lunch time. Counselors will assist campers if / when needed. Otherwise, campers need to be able to apply it themselves.

Please label ALL personal belongings with your child's name, including the Recreation Center t-shirt that they receive on the first day of camp attended.

Do I have to fill out a medical form?

No. Please be sure to include any allergy or medical notes in your child's participant profile online. Please email the Camp Director at campcoor@ridgefieldct.gov if your child will need medication while at camp.

How do you handle allergies?

First, we strictly enforce our nut-free food policy by not allowing campers to unwrap or eat a food brought from home that we suspect contains nuts. Please check all packaging such as granola bars, popcorn, etc. for traces of nut products. Campers are not separated at snack or lunch time according to their allergy status.

Second, EpiPens should be clearly labeled with your child's name. All EpiPens should be placed in a clear plastic bag with a doctor-authorized form and photo of the child. Bring the bag to the first day of camp and give to your child's Head Counselor. All EpiPens are stored in the medical bag assigned to each group's head counselor and travel with the group as that group moves from activity to activity. Additionally, this bag goes on all field trips.

If your child has an allergy, please be sure to clearly note this in your child's participant profile online, and/or email the Camp Director at campcoor@ridgefieldct.gov.

What time does camp begin and end?

Camp begins at 9:00 am and ends at 4:00 pm.

Is there an extended-day option?

Before and after care options are available this year. See website for more details. Breakfast Bunch: Monday to Friday, 8:00-9:00 am, \$35 members, \$45 non-members (per week / per child). Creative Care: Monday to Thursday, 4:00-5:00 pm, \$75 per week / 4 day week. Creative Care Extended: Monday to Thursday, 4:00-5:30 pm, \$100 per week / 4 day week.

May I drop my child off at the curb?

Yes, and in fact, this is our procedure for campers arriving at and leaving from camp due to limited parking. Curbside drop-off is assigned at 8:45 am or 9:00 am by groups, which will be communicated to parents in the letter the week before your child's camp.

We ask families to put GROUP and CAMPER name on a sign in the front window of your vehicle. Parents pull up to your child's camp group sign as far forward as possible while not blocking the crosswalks or handicap spaces. Camp staff will approach and assist campers into/out of vehicles on the curb side ONLY. Do not drop off your child unless a staff member is present, and please do not leave your vehicle. For safety, drive slowly and use your directional signal while pulling away from the curb, as cars will be passing on the left side.

What if I want to pick up my child early from camp?

Parents or guardians should email the Camp Director at campcoor@ridgefieldct.gov stating the time of departure, name and phone number of the person picking up the camper, even if that person will be the parent or guardian. Parent/Guardian must park and come inside the Recreation Center. Please approach the front desk and ask for the Camp Director or the Camp Coordinator. Child(ren) will be brought to you in the front lobby.

How is Adventure Day Camp organized and staffed?

Campers are organized into age groups and do age-appropriate activities together. Our experienced Camp Director and Coordinator are responsible for planning activities and trips each week of camp. Each age group has a Head Counselor who handles most of your child's needs on a daily basis. This highly experienced staff member is your best resource for questions during camp. There are also assistant counselors for each group. Campers should learn their counselors' names.

We provide the following staff-to-camper ratios:

Explorers and Pioneers: 1:5 Rangers, Travelers, Trailblazers & Voyagers: 1:7 We reserve the right to combine age groups to maintain our established ratios.

Discoverers: 1:10

What type of outdoor activities will my child do at camp?

We utilize all of the outdoor areas of our Recreation Center campus. Outdoor activities include nature studies (pond visits, nature walks, etc.), outdoor water fun, relay games, sports, scavenger hunts, and walks/hikes on our paved trails. Special events are also planned for all groups. Campers in grades 2-6 will visit Martin Park Beach on Tuesdays.

Will my child visit Martin Park Beach and/or the pool?

It depends on which age group your child is in.

Explorers (age 4) will not go to the pool or beach. However, we will cool off with outdoor water games, sprinklers, and the Spray Bay.

Being a bit older, Pioneers (entering K), and Rangers (grade 1), will enjoy the zero-entry section of our pool for recreation swim. They will also enjoy all of the other water activities on campus as described above. Travelers (grade 2), Trailblazers (grade 3), Voyagers (grade 4), and Discoverers (grade 5/6) also enjoy the outdoor water activities and will be scheduled for swimming in appropriate area of the pool.

Grades 2-6 will have time for fun at Martin Park Beach on Tuesdays.

Swim ability tests will be given by the aquatic staff to determine skill level at both the beach and pool. You may speak to the Camp Director with any questions or concerns.

Will my child be receiving swim lessons?

Swim Lessons require a separate registration. Every camper has the option to register for one of our full American Red Cross certified lessons. If the lesson is during camp hours, our staff will be available to get your camper to his/her assigned class.

If your child is registered for swim lessons, please email the Camp Director at campcoor@ridgefieldct.gov to arrange for a counselor to escort your child to and/or from their lesson.

What types of field trips will my child go on?

On the Monday of your camper's field trip week, detailed information will be sent home with your child. ALL campers are given a camp shirt to wear on field trips, including Martin Park Beach. Field trips are weather permitting. See field trip schedule on our website.

In the event of poor weather, you may call the Front Desk the morning of the trip for updates. There are no refunds for canceled field trips. However, we make every attempt to replace a canceled field trip with a special and age-appropriate activity.

What if I do not want my child to participate in a particular field trip or they are unable to attend part of it?

This child would have to stay home that day. All of your child's counselors will be leaving the building and children may not join another group. This sometimes comes into question when a child has an afternoon doctor's appointment or morning summer school. No refunds are given in these situations.

My child is at the younger end of your age range. Does he/she need to be potty trained?

All campers need to be fully potty trained and four years old by September 1, 2024. No exceptions will be made.

What if my child has a special need?

Please share information about any special needs your child may have in your child's participant profile online (i.e. prone to ear infections, allergies and carries a kit, has a hearing deficiency, has an IEP, physical/social limitations, etc.) Provide as much information as possible so that we may accommodate your child to ensure his/her camp experience is positive and fun. You may also arrange a pre-camp meeting to discuss any special needs/requests with our Camp Director. Please email campcoor@ridgefieldct.gov with details and / or to arrange a meeting or phone call.

Who should I speak to about my individual concerns?

If you have questions or concerns that we have not addressed in our printed materials or on our website, please call the Recreation Center Front Desk at (203) 431-2755. Our staff will be happy to answer any questions you may have. If you still have questions or concerns, please ask to speak with the Camp Director or the Camp Coordinator, or send an email to campcoor@ridgefieldct.gov.

Adventure Day Camp Policies



We ask all campers and their parents to be mindful of our Adventure Day Camp policies and acknowledge their responsibilities. Upon registration, you are asked to agree to the following terms.

Parent's Medical Authorization

I recognize that while attending camp my child may suffer an injury or become ill. In the event of an emergency, every effort will be made to contact me using the emergency phone number(s) provided. If I cannot be reached, I give permission to ADC staff and to the staff of Ridgefield Parks & Recreation to seek medical assistance. I give permission to any emergency personnel and to any attending physician to render emergency medical treatment. I assume all financial responsibility for services rendered that are not covered by my child's medical insurance coverage.

Sunscreen Permission

I give permission for ADC counselors to assist my child to apply their parent-provided sunscreen 1 time daily.

Electronics & Social Media

For safety/privacy reasons and to ensure engagement in activities, the use of cell phones, iPods, iPads, MP3 Players, and electronic games during camp hours is prohibited. If a camper brings any hand held electronics, it must stay in the camper's bag or it may be confiscated by Camp Administration. We are not responsible for any items that may be lost or stolen.

Behavior Policy

All Adventure Day Camp counselors are trained in managing their group to provide a safe and positive experience for our campers. Disruptive behavior, physical aggression and/or inappropriate language is not acceptable. Strategies for dealing with misbehavior are provided by Camp Administration. Campers will be encouraged to learn from any mistakes made; however, if misbehavior continues, the camper may be asked to sit out of an activity and parents will be contacted. Campers will be given the opportunity to correct behaviors after these steps occur; but if no effort or progress is made, they will be dismissed from camp without a refund. Serious behaviors will not be tolerated, such as wandering away from the group, any form of theft, disrespect toward others and/or their property, bullying or violence of any sort that may put any of our participants or staff at risk. These behaviors may result in permanent dismissal. Adventure Day Camp reserves the right to remove a camper from our program without a refund.

Illness Policy

We ask that children are symptom free (such as fever, vomiting, diarrhea) for 24 hours before returning to camp. Please notify the Camp Director of any serious illness (i.e. pink eye, chicken pox, broken limb) and provide a doctor's note before returning to camp. We must be considerate of all the other families attending camp and do our best not to spread illness. A doctor's note may be required to return to camp.

Late Pick-up Fee

Any camper left at camp past 4:00 pm will be charged a late fee. The fee will be waived for first 5 minutes after dismissal. After the first five minutes, there will be a charge of \$25 for each 15 minute interval you are late. This fee must be paid within 24 hours of late pick up.

Refund Policy

Programs are refundable up to 3 weeks prior to session start date and subject to administrative approval. Medical absences (verified by a physician's note) will be refunded on a prorated basis. No retroactive discounts will be applied and discounts cannot be combined other than the Sibling Discount. No refunds will be given due to canceled field trips. Transfers may be requested up to one week prior to session start date and are subject to administrative approval. A fee of \$25 per week, per child, will be assessed to all refunds and transfers. All discounts applied at the time of registration that are no longer applicable, will be deducted from the refund total (e.g. Early Bird and Sibling Discounts).

Registration Deadline

I understand that all registration transactions must be completed and paid for by the Wednesday before the week of camp my child is attending.

For Camp Levels Grade 2 and above (Travelers, Trailblazers, Voyagers, Discoverers) Field Trip Permission

I give permission for my child to participate in Ridgefield Parks & Recreation ADC field trips, which include Martin Park Beach on Tuesdays and a group specific field trip on Thursdays. I understand the schedule will be provided to me in advance of the camp week and that all field trips are subject to change, due to inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances. I understand a waiver may be required for certain trips and that my child cannot participate in such trips without a completed waiver signed by a parent/guardian.

I release Parks & Recreation, its employees, instructors and the Day Camp program of all liability. I understand that this release applies to any present or future injuries.

Late pick-up policy: Any camper left at camp late will be charged a late fee. After a five-minute grace period, there will be a charge of \$25.00 for each 15 minute interval you are late. This fee must be paid within 24 hours of late pick up.
